Emergency Food Assistance Brings Hope to Flood Affected Families

Standing with Communities in Crisis, Bangladesh

During a time of flooding in Bangladesh, 150 food packages were distributed to flood-affected people and new believers in Christ in Selabunia–Mongla, Batiaghata–Khulna, and Barishal. Each package contained 20 kg of rice, 2 kg of lentils, 1 kg of salt, and 1 kg of cooking oil, providing essential food support to families facing immediate hardship.



The distribution was done through the collaboration of local churches, faith leaders, and local government representatives that strengthening community ownership and ensuring that assistance reached people in need in a

timely and dignified manner. For many recipients, the support was more than food, it was a tangible expression of God's love, compassion, and kindness during a difficult time. Several beneficiaries shared that they felt genuinely remembered and cared for through this timely assistance.

The initiative reflects the compassion of Jesus Christ, who saw the hunger of the multitude and provided food for 5,000 people (Matthew 14:13–21). Inspired by His example, the churches sought to respond not only to spiritual needs but also to the immediate physical needs of vulnerable families.

"This is real love and kindness shown to us during this emergency period," shared one grateful recipient.
